It is anticipated that students in the Social Science (Environment & Community) MA program will also take the course (although it is not required). 5. CSU Ethnic Studies Task Force	 5. CSU Ethnic Studies Task Force The presented document recommended several strategies for the growth of Ethnic Studies courses in the CSU system. Improvements were recommended in the Area E GE courses, as well as in the advising system to guide more students to ES courses at HSU. The committee provided a multitude of feedback on the presented document. Some concerns include: Limited platform for feedback, as the online response form is limited to 1400 characters. Misconception regarding Title V and GE courses, Title V does NOT preclude one from taking Ethnic Studies as a GE. Broad policy changes across the CSU should be avoided, as they could negatively affect other campuses not experiencing the issues at hand.
