11-466 - HSU New Course Proposal, GEOG 309 C “Social Justice in Africa” (i.e. Summer Semester in Senegal)

The “Summer Semester in Senegal” proposal from Geography is presented again; however, it is evident the proposal was reformed greatly with respect to UD Area B. As a general refresher, this course is part of a package that seeks to give French and Francophone studies students a one-of-a-kind experience in Africa for 10 weeks during the summer months (2015, then every other year afterwards) where they will be exposed to French language, Senegalese culture, ecology, environmental science, African heritage, religion, and a host of other experiences that are too numerous to list. This experience will complete a 9-unit UD GE “package”, where students will receive credit for UD GE C, D, CWT/Area B, and DCG non-domestic.. In this summary attention is drawn to the Area B SLO matrix (see attached), where the various activities, assignments, and assessments that will be completed clearly demonstrate a strong satisfaction of CWT/UD GE B. In fact, many science majors (namely ecology/environmental science) would be lucky to obtain an experience similar to this as this summer experience goes above and beyond what can be offered in a typical science laboratory/classroom.
